BMW to launch new Z

The Bavaria-based automaker and its new best friend Toyota have been busily plugging away on their joint-venture sports cars. From the intel that these peach-colored pages have picked up, BMW's version will be called the Z5 while Toyota is report-

All-wheel-drive will likely be standard with six-cylinder Z5 models. The least expensive version is expected to cost significantly more than the Z4, which in the United States begins in the low-\$50,000

range. The Z5 is expected to launch in early 2018.

name. It will be larger than the current Z4 (think Jaguar F-Type) and will come with a soft top in place of the Z4's retractable solid roof. A turbocharged four-cylinder engine will be standard, while an inline six-cylinder (also turbocharged) will be optional.

For now, the base engine in the new four-door Porsche Panamera is a 440hp turbo V-6

If this boxy Mercedes-Benz G-Class looks familiar, it should since it has been around for decades. A new model is in the works that will be significantly wider, but not longer.

G, a new Mercedes-Benz

The German automaker's boxy, military-spec off-roader has been around in one form or another for decades, but we can confirm that a completely new Mercedes-Benz G-Class will make its debut in 2018 as a 2019 model. This time the super (as in powerful and pricey) off-roader will gain about four inches in width, apparently to accommodate new suspension pieces. Surprisingly, though, body length has been slightly reduced. That, along with greater use of aluminum body panels and various components and smaller and lighter



We're all big fans here of the Porsche Panamera four-door hatchback sedan, but his mind has been blown by the second-generation model that's due out for the 2017 model year. From every angle the Panamera's mostly aluminum body is considerably sleeker and from the front the car now resembles the 911. The Panamera also gets a brand new platform, resulting in slightly more distance between the front and rear wheels as well as in terms of overall length. Initially, North American buyers can choose from a twin-turbocharged 2.9-liter V-6 that makes 440 horsepower, or optional twin-turbo 4.0-liter V-8 with 550 horses. Both engines come with eight-speed transmissions and all-wheel-drive is standard. Pricing is expected to start in the \$100,000 range. A plug-in hybrid Panamera as well as wagon body style will arrive later.


TEST DRIVE 2016 Dodge Challenger

Continued from page 1 This week's test car packed the 392 Hemi, which generates 475 lb.-ft. of torque to go with that 485 h.p. Dodge says that it tops out at 182 mph, and makes 60 mph from a standstill in the low four-second range. You don't need a stop watch to tell you that it's enormously quick, and it's easy (too easy) to spin the tires, even on routine tasks like pulling out of your street on a busy morning. For those who want to spend some of their spare time at the drag strip, the Super Drag Pak option includes tweaks to steering, brakes, tires, suspension, paddle shifters and performance-related trip computer functions. The motor is also completely at ease puttering around town. This only seems like a big deal if you've ever owned a classic era big block car, in the days before technology overcame the problem of overheating. Getting caught in summer traffic and watching the temperature gauge creep up was (and is) enough to raise a bead of sweat on your forehead in no time.

improved the cabin's looks (though a white interior option would be a coo retro option on Plum Crazy cars like this one). A media hub was added in the center console, and includes an SD card slot. USB outlet and auxiliary input jack. The dashboard is sectioned off by aluminumstamped bezels, and a bank of controls are angled toward the driver. The available 8.4-inch Uconnect touchscreen is a cabin highlight; legibly large and more user friendly than most. Front and side visibility is generally good; this generation of Camaro feels rather claustrophobic by comparison. However, the combination of thick c-pillars and fat headrests create big 34 rear blind spots. Blind-spot monitoring and rear cross-traffic alert are included as part of the Driver Convenience Group, along with rear parking sensors, HID bi-xenon headlights, power folding mirrors and remote ignition (on automatic equipped models), so the \$1,095 option package is highly recommended. Challenger's size pays dividends in passenger and cargo room. You can fit adults in the back seat if you choose to,
